

Lesson 1: Animal Health: Making Cows Smile

Lesson Introduction

Dairy farming is a way of life for over 40,000 farm families in the United States. Dairy farmers have a very important job to do. In this lesson, students will learn ways farmers care for their cows every day and some of the people helping the dairy farmer care for their animals. The lesson will also highlight the career of being a dairy farmer.

Lesson Objectives

- Students will define important dairy vocabulary terms.
- Students will list at least three ways dairy farmers care for their cows.
- Students will list the skills and responsibilities of being a dairy farmer.

Procedure

Introduction (5 minutes)

- Introduction
- **Activating Strategy:** Let's look at how dairy farmers take care of their cows by watching the video, [Fun on the Farm with Farmer Caroline](#).

Words on a Dairy Farm (5 minutes)

- Go over the essential vocabulary terms and their meanings for this lesson.
- Use the Lesson 1 PowerPoint with the students to show the meaning in pictures.

Farmers Care for Their Cows (10 minutes)

- Introduction
- Go over the four main responsibilities of a dairy farmer.
- Use the Lesson 1 PowerPoint Slides 15-18 to show the comparison of parents and dairy farmers with their care of children and cows respectively.

Career Spotlight: Veterinarian (6 minutes)

- Introduction
- Facilitate the Career Spotlight on the Dairy Farmer using the video and discussion of other responsibilities of dairy farmers.
- Closure: Dairy farmers have a lot of responsibilities other than taking care of their cows.
 - Tell us one responsibility of a dairy farmer.
 - Are you interested in being a dairy farmer when you grow up?

Summative Activity (15-30 minutes, depending on the activities)

- Introduction
- Pass out Activity to students.
- Allow students class time to complete the Activity.
- Walk around, offering help and answering questions as needed.
- **Lesson Closure:** Today you learned about what dairy farmers do every day to take care of their cows, so we have milk to keep us healthy. Tell us one way that dairy farmers take care of their cows.
